Kouraku Kiln to have a unique product offering. The site is directed by the fifth generation head of the Kouraku company, Mr Tokunaga Takanobu who's now holding a variety of projects aiming to make Kouraku Kiln famous, nationally and internationally, for its refined techniques making porcelain.

Arita Sera

Arita Será is a big shopping mall which has 22 shops specialized in Arita-yaki. Here you can find tableware for daily use and for professional use, gifts and even high-end art objects, all at the same place.

Kyushu Ceramic Museum

Discover the birth of Japanese porcelain with an amazing collection of 'Arita' porcelain ware made from the finest kaolin (the clay used for making porcelain)

Continue to Matsue by train


Shimane Art Museum

Visit Adachi Museum first thing in the morning.

Adachi Museum

The gardens vary in appearance every day. In fact, we might never see each beautiful moment again, and therefore the whole garden is always full of beauty. The founder Adachi Zenko, with the belief of “the garden is also a picture”, devoted himself to gardening until he died at the age of 91. The gardens, including the Dry Landscape Garden, are about 165,000 square meters in total. They show various seasonal faces and have good balance with the surrounding natural mountains. Thus, Adachi’s gardens are said to be a ‘living Japanese painting’. Continue through the museum to enjoy an amazing selection of painting and ukiyo-e or if time allows enjoy tea with a stunning view.

Return to Matesu Station, and catch bus to Yuushien.

Yuushien Garden

A totally different style of garden to what we visited this morning. Yuushien, a 'miniature garden of Izumo', featuring landscapes and mythology of Izumo area, is a traditional Japanese-styled walk-through garden around ponds. The colours of Autumn will be casting a spell of the pending winter. Certainly, a photographer’s delight.

Matsue Castle

Eikando Temple

Eikando is very famous for its autumn colors. The temple has a long history, and there are a variety of buildings and a pond garden that visitors can explore. Eikando's most recognizable building, however, is its Tahoto Pagoda, which is nestled in the trees on the hillside above the temple's other buildings. Tahoto-style pagoda are two story structures, whose first stories are square and second stories are round. Visitors can walk up to the pagoda, from where the rest of the temple grounds and the city of Kyoto can be seen.

Evening walk around Gion

Stroll the streets and lanes of Gion, Kyoto's geisha district, with hostesses in colourful kimonos often sighted on the wooden Tatsumi Bridge, or amid upscale Japanese restaurants and boutiques on Hanamikoji Street. During you walk you may glimpse a Geiko or Maiko on their way to an engagement. Please be respectful.

Friday · November 3rd



Tenryuji

It was ranked first among the city's five great Zen temples and is now registered as a world heritage site. Unlike the temple buildings, Tenryuji garden has survived centuries in its original form

Kinkakuji (Golden Temple)

Often quoted as one of the most beautiful buildings in Kyoto. The two top floors covered in gold leaf create a golden reflection in the large pond. The temple has been destroyed numerous times with the most recent in 1950. What we see today was rebuilt in 1955.

The garden complex incorporates many Zen elements, expressed through the placement of rocks, bridges etc. Notice how the garden is a Shakkei style garden. Shakkei (called "borrowed scenery" in English) is a way to design gardens so they appear to be a part of the surrounding nature.

Nijo Castle

Built in 1603 as the home for the Tokugawa shogun and 23 years later completed by his grandson. The castle ground becomes a picture in spring with the 400 cherry trees but we should be delighted by the brilliant autumn colours of maple, ginkgo and other trees





'Rene Lalique' Museum

The Lalique Museum, Hakone owns the collection of more than 1,500 works by Lalique including over 200 precious jewellery. Immerse yourself in treasures by René Lalique (1860-1945) a French artist of “Art Nouveau” and “Art Deco” era, primarily known as a craftsman of the objects in glass and as a master jeweller.

Pola museum

“I'm standing in a national park in Hakone. The untouched nature and the modelling designed by people. The two become one, and the dignified time flows”

Entering the building one gets the feeling of stepping into an cave opening out into the bush. Enjoy the exhibits inside as well as sculptures throughout the surrounding untouched bush

Sengokuhara Suski Grass Fields

One's breath is taken away at the sight of golden coloured Susuki (pampass grass) covering the west side of Mount Hakone swaying in the breeze. You can walk along the path through the centre where the grasses stand taller than you

Venetian Glass Museum

Stroll through an Italian styled building to view priceless glass artifacts from the 16th century right up to modern day works by artists such as Dale Chihuly building. Treasures can also be seen in the pond and through the garden

Hakone Ropeway

Founded in 1670, Zuishōji Temple is a historic religious building, also known for its modern quarters designed by the famous Japanese architect Kengo Kuma. The elegant U shaped form of wood and steel surround a pool with a raise platform for ceremonies

Koishikawa Korakuen

Koishikawa Korakuen Gardens is arguably one of the most beautiful and oldest gardens in Tokyo. With a rich history and subtle influences from China, the garden maintains an exquisite aesthetic appeal throughout the seasons. There are reproductions of both famous Japanese and Chinese scenery throughout the garden, represented by the miniature hills, ponds, stones and trees and as you walk around the pond you will see a different view every few steps

Yayoi Kasuma Museum

The museum for avant-garde artist Yayoi Kasuma was opened in 2017. The dedicated museum will give visitors a chance to learn about the courageous battles that Kusama has fought as an avant-garde artist, allowing them to experience and feel the sincerity of her ideas, namely of saving the world through love.

Meiji Jingu

Meiji Jingu is one of the Shinto shrines in Japan, with the vast land of the forest (70 ha.), located in the middle of the megacity, Tokyo. Thanks to the donation of 100,000 trees from all over Japan, and the voluntary works of the youth, this precinct was completed on the 1st of November, 1920. This forest is a manmade forest, being aimed to be a self-regenerating natural forest, which was so planned by the forestry experts foreseeing 100 years ahead.

Chrysanthemum Festival Meiji Jingu

See Chrysanthemums like you have never seen before all shapes, colours and sizes, ranging from cascading chrysanthemums to one that has over 500 blooms on one plant.

Meiji Jingu Museum

Newly opened in 2019, designed by architect Kengo Kuma. Wood is an important feature of Kuma's designs, and this museum is no exception. The museum displays articles used by or associated with Emperor Meiji and Empress Shoken in 3,200 square meter of display space spread over two floors.

Rikugien Garden Illuminations

Lights reflecting off the red and golden leaves emphasize their colour and beauty. When you combine lit up autumn leaves with the gorgeous layout of the landscape design, Rikugi-en Garden's autumn and many other galleires
